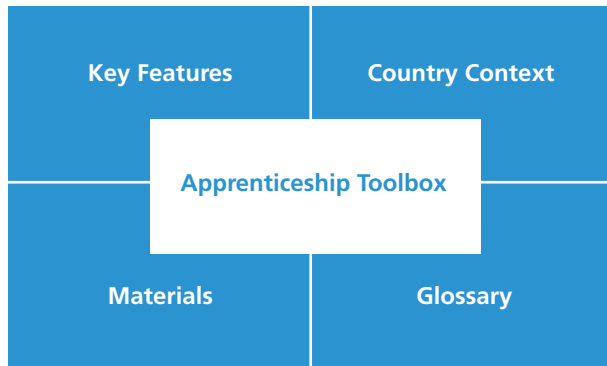

In the dual-track system the apprentices are full staff members of a company, and the training they undertake is ruled by an apprenticeship contract. Companies play an important role in training and social partners are actively involved in regulations and development of qualifications.
